Breakaway Scholarship

Program Overview*

The Ed Snider Youth Hockey Foundation seeks to improve the quality of educational options and expand the financial support available to Snider Hockey students throughout their secondary education.

Students accepted into the *Breakaway Scholarship* program will receive a one-year scholarship to cover full or partial tuition and school fees at one of the high schools in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This scholarship is renewable for up to three additional years if students continue to meet eligibility criteria.

Student Eligibility*

Snider Hockey students will be initially accepted into the *Breakaway Scholarship* program during their final year of middle school.

To apply for the program, students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be a current member of Snider Hockey in good standing
- Be a current 8th grade student
- Have joined Snider Hockey prior to the completion of the 6th grade
- Apply to [one of the Faith in the Future high schools](#) and be accepted
- Complete the *Breakaway Scholarship* application
- Complete the initial [FACTS Grant and Aid](#) application
- Complete an individual counseling session with a parent/guardian
- Submit the final 7th grade year report card to Snider Hockey
- Submit the most recent 8th grade year report card to Snider Hockey
- **Demonstrate significant financial need based on FACTS Grant & Aid household income guidelines**
 - Level of financial need, as determined by the Archdiocese, will be relevant in the selection process

Financial Aid & Scholarships

FACTS Grand & Aid - FACTS is used for Catholic School Tuition. Similar to FAFSA, families must submit tax information to find out how much financial aid they NEED and how much financial aid they are REWARDED. Students looking to attend Catholic school MUST submit a FACTS application.

Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Information - Many private and Catholic schools accept EITC information to give families with low/moderate income a tax break.

Catholic School Scholarship/Assistance Information - There are many scholarships and financial assistance programs out there designed for families in need

BLOCS Scholarship Information - Catholic Schools - Catholic schools have specific scholarships for families and students in need of financial assistance.

Ellis Trust - Ellis Trust is a grant for high school girls. There are specific eligibility requirements. This grant is for public, independent private, and parochial schools.

- **PECO's** Customer Assistance Program (CAP) provides a monthly credit for eligible low income customers. The credit is based on the customer's total household gross income and energy usage.
- **INTERNET ESSENTIALS** is a low cost internet (\$9.95) source. Must have at least one child eligible for free lunch, no outstanding balance with Comcast, and no Comcast service within the last 90 days.

CLOTHING/HOME GOODS

- **GOODWILL STORES** are located in Avondale, Thorndale, Exton, Phoenixville, and Frazer
